# The Birth of Jesus

#### Luke 2:1-7

### Introduction:

- A. Birth of ordinary baby exciting: Name? Looks? Future?
- B. Birth of Mary's baby not ordinary.
  - 1. To be called:
    - a. "Jesus" (Matt. 1:21).
    - b. "Immanuel" (Matt. 1:23).
    - c. "Son of the Highest" (Lk. 1:32).
  - 2. To be king. (Lk. 1:33; John 18:37).
- C. Facts about birth of Jesus:

#### Discussion:

- I. Jesus Was Born of a Virgin. (Matt. 1:18-25).
  - A. Miraculous rather than providential (Cf. John Baptist, Isaac, etc.)
  - B. Test of faith for Joseph and Mary.
  - C. Crucial to our faith.
    - 1. If no virgin birth then:
      - a. No dual nature.
        - (1) Not "God with us" (v. 23).
        - (2) Not a special high priest. (cf. Heb. 4:14-16)
      - b. Bible is farce.
      - c. Christianity is hoax.
    - 2. Prophesied by Isaiah (7:14, Matt. 1:22,23).
      - a. Attacked by modernism. (cf. RSV).
      - b. No sign if not a virgin.

## II. Jesus Was Born in "Fullness of Time." (Gal. 4:4).

- A. Timing important for any major event.
  - 1. Natural events.
  - 2. Political events.
  - 3. Courtship and marriage.
  - 4. Space exploration.
- B. Timing important in birth of the Savior.
  - 1. After careful preparation.
    - a. Patriarchal promises.
    - b. Chosen nation.
    - c. Law of Moses. (cf. Gal. 3:24; 4:1-4).
    - d. Prophecy.
  - 2. After events had taken shape.
    - a. After Jews proved could not save self by works of law.
    - b. After Pagans proved could not save self by wisdom.
    - c. After Greek became universal language.
    - d. After Romans provided political and logistical climate for spread of gospel.

### III. Jesus Was Born to Save. (Matt. 1:21).

- A. Saves from sin.
  - 1. Not temporal consequences: poverty, suffering, sickness and injustice, etc.
  - 2. But guilt and eternal consequences.
- B. Saves conditionally. (Mark 16:15,16; Heb. 5:8,9).
  - 1. Else universal salvation.
  - 2. Or arbitrary salvation. (cf. Acts 10:34,35).
- C. Saves all kinds of people.
  - 1. Crucifiers. (Acts 2:36-38,41,47)

- 2. Sorcerers. (Acts 8:13ff)
- Persecutors. (Acts 9)
  Pagan Jailers. (Acts 16:25-34).
- 5. Moral men. (Acts 10:)
- 6. Immoral men. (1 Cor. 6:9-11).

## Conclusion:

- A. Jesus born of virgin, in fullness of time, to save sinners like us.
- B. Jesus born to be your savior and king, why not let him be? (cf. Matt. 28:18-20).
