 - 1. A ring.
 - 2. Sailor at sea sees only water.
 - 3. Telescope out into space.
 - 4. If earth steel ball eagles wing tips each 1000 years wears it away.
 - 5. If ant carried gain of sand to sun removes all from earth.
 - 6. Certain number grains of sand, blades of grass, drops of water, leaves of trees if one of destroyed each billion years.

II. Its Associations.

 - 2. Everlasting punishment and destruction (Matt. 25:46: 2 Thess. 1:9).
