 - A. Did have to know all before beginning.
 - B. Recognized his and business and God's business.
 - 1. Secret things belong to God revealed to us (Duet. 29:29)
 - 2. Need to mind our own business (John 21:21-22)

II. When He Settled With Lot (Gen. 13:5-13).

- A. Peace more important than temporal advantage.
- B. Eternal values more important than temporal advantage.
- C. Peace & edification is more important than piece of meat (Rom. 14:17).

III. When He Was Promised a Son (Gen. 15:1-6; 16-18; Rom. 4:16-25).

- A. Could not depend on own strength (Rom. 4:21; cf. Gideon).
- B. Gave God the glory (Rom. 4:20; cf. 1 Cor. 1:27-31).

IV. When He Pleaded for Sodom (Gen. 18:23-33).

- A. Persistence in prayer (cf. Luke 18:1-5).
- B. His concern of others.

V. When He offered Isaac (Gen. 22:1-19).

- A. Had to overcome personal emotions.
- B. Had to overcome a seeming contradiction (cf. Heb. 11:17-19).

Conclusion:

- A. Abraham was not perfect great men have weaknesses.
 - 1. Laughed at God (Gen. 17:17).
 - 2. Lied about Sarah.
- B. Abraham was great example of faith faith overcomes weakness.
