- A. By the prophets.
 - 1. The promised ruler (Mic. 5:2; Matt. 2:6).
 - 2. Daniel and Nebuchadnezzar's dream (Dan 2:36-44)
- B. By John and Jesus.
 - 1. At hand (Matt. 3:2; 4:17).
 - 2. In lifetime of that generation (Mk. 9:1).

II. The Kingdom Realized.

- A. The king is anointed (Acts 2:29-36).
- B. Early Christians in the kingdom (Col. 1:13; Col. 1:9).

III. The Kingdom Identified.

- A. Not a political kingdom (John 19:33-37).
- B. "Church" and "Kingdom" interchangeable.
 - 1. Jesus' usage of the words (Matt. 16:18).
 - 2. Lord's supper in church/kingdom (Lk. 22:16,18; Acts 20:7; 1 Cor. 11:23-260.
 - 3. Head and King by same process (Acts 2:29-36; Eph. 1:20-23).
 - 4. Hebrew writer (Heb. 12:23, 28).

IV. The Kingdom Glorified.

- A. Delivered up at Christ's coming. (1 Cor. 15:22-25).
- B. Everlasting phase still future (2 Pet. 1:11; 1 Cor. 15:50; 6:9, 10; Gal. 5:21).
