

# Jesus: Lord of All

## Acts 10:34-43

### Introduction:

- A. Peter was given keys of kingdom. (Matt. 16:18,19).
  - 1. Had opened door for Jews. (Acts 2).
  - 2. Now opens door for Gentiles. (Acts 10).
- B. Peter's theme was "Jesus, Lord of **all**" — Jews & Gentiles.(v. 36).
- C. Peter's sermon made three basic point about Jesus:

### Discussion:

#### **I. He Is Lord of All. (v. 36).**

- A. Anointed with Holy Spirit (v. 38; cf. Mark 3:22-30).
- B. Raised from the dead (v.40; cf. Rom. 1:4)
  - 1. Without the resurrection, just a dead Jew.
  - 2. With the resurrection, a living Savior. (cf. 1 Cor. 15:17).
    - a. King over kingdom. (Acts 2:30-33).
    - b. Head over church. (Eph. 1:20-23).
- C. Witnessed by chosen ones — apostles. (vv. 39-41).
  - 1. Witnessed his good works (vv. 38-39)
  - 2. Witnessed his death and resurrection (v. 39-41).
- D. Witnessed by Old Testament prophets. (v. 43; cf. 2 Pet. 1:16-21).

#### **II. He Is Judge of All. (v. 42).**

- A. Judgement is coming. (Acts 17:30; Heb. 9:27).
- B. Judgement demands preparation.
  - 1. Calls for preaching. (v. 42; cf. Mk. 16:15).
  - 2. Calls for response. (vs. 43-48; cf. Acts 17:30).

#### **III. He Is Impartial to All. (v. 34-35).**

- A. As Lord and Savior. (vs. 34-35, 43).
  - 1. Crosses national and political lines.
  - 2. Crosses ethic and racial lines.
  - 3. Crosses social and economic lines.
- B. As Judge. (v. 42; cf. Rom. 2:5-11).

### Conclusion:

- A. **Anyone** who obeys Him will be saved. (v. 35; 47,48).
- B. **Anyone** who disobeys Him will be lost.
