Introduction:

- A. Paul rebukes the Corinthians for their divisions (vv. 3-4)
 - 1. Caused by making men the foundation if their faith.
 - a. Men are mere servants (vv. 5-10).
 - b. The house and field belong to God (v. 9)
 - 2. Only one foundation can legitimately laid (v. 11).
- B. Let's consider some characteristics of this foundation:

- C. Distinguished by His perpetuity (Dan. 2:44, 45; Heb. 7:24, 25).

- A. No other foundation will do.
- B. Yet, men continue to build on foundations of sand.
 - 1. Themselves (2 Cor. 4:5).
 - 2. Other men (v. 4).
 - 3. Human wisdom (1 Cor. 2:4).
 - a. Philosophical.
 - b. Religious
 - 4. Human strength (1 Cor. 1:25-31)
 - a. Physical.
 - b. Social.
 - c. Political.
