

Paul's Parting Words to the Ephesian Elders

Acts 20:17-38

Introduction:

- A. Paul's work at Ephesus.
 - 1. Found small group - about 12 men (vv. 1, 7)
 - 2. Corrected their baptism (vv. 3-5)
 - 3. Stayed there over 2 years (v. 8-10).
 - 4. Converted many (vv. 18-20).
 - 5. Stirred up controversy – silversmith's riot.
 - 6. Church grew enough to have elders.
- B. Paul's journey from Ephesus.
 - 1. Goes to Macedonia.
 - 2. Spends 3 months in Greece
 - 3. Sails from for Syria from Philippi.
 - 4. Calls for Elders to come Melitus.
- C. Paul's words to the Ephesian touches on three great needs of the Lord's church.

Discussion:

I. The Need for *Sacrifice*.

- A. Paul's example of sacrifice.
 - 1. His safety (vv. 19, 22-24).
 - 2. His right to support (vv. 33-34; cf. 1 Cor. 9:6-14)
 - 3. His money (vv. 34-35).
- B. Christians must have a spirit of sacrifice.
 - 1. Time, money, relationships, even our lives. (cf. Luke 14:26-27, 33).
 - 2. Seeking the kingdom first requires sacrifice (cf. Things people give up to attend, give, etc.)

II. The Need for *Vigilance*.

- A. Vigilance in feeding the church (v. 28)
 - 1. A wholesome diet (v. 32)
 - 2. A balanced diet – positive and negative – milk and meat – encouragement and rebuke.
 - 3. Vigilance in being fed (cf. 1 Pet. 2:2)
- B. Vigilance in guarding the church (vv. 29-31)
 - 1. External error (v. 29).
 - 2. Internal error (v. 30).

III. The Need for *Thoroughness*.

- A. The thoroughness of Paul's preaching (vv. 20, 26).
 - 1. "The truth, the whole truth, nothing but the truth."
 - 2. Not enough to just preach the truth.
 - a. The whole truth.
 - b. The needed truth.
- B. The thoroughness of our desire for truth.
 - 1. Cornelius wanted all truth (cf. Acts 10:33).
 - 2. Church must endure (accept and support) thorough teaching (cf. 2 Tim 4:2-4)

- A. Sacrifice - vigilance - thoroughness: What about us?
- B. If you are not a Christian, what could be more profitable than becoming a Christian?
- C. If you are a backslider, what could be more profitable than being restored?
