"They Made Light of It" - Part 2

Matt. 22:1-14

Introduction:

- A. In part one, we noticed the seriousness of taking the things of the Lord lightly.
 - 1. The invited guests and the guest without wedding garment.
 - 2. Sin, salvation, marriage, church, and attendance.
- B. In this part, we notice five others areas that are often taken too lightly.

Discussion:

I. People Often Take Worship Too Lightly.

- A. By carelessness in what they do in worship to God. (John 4:24; Mt 15:9).
- B. By carelessness in how they worship lack of reverence and godly fear (cf. Heb 12:28).

II. People Often Take Bible Study Too Lightly.

- A. The danger of ignorance (Hos. 6:4; Acts 17:30).
- B. The need to study (2 Tim. 2:15; Acts 17:11).
 - 1. Neglect church's Bible classes preparation and participation.
 - 2. Neglect home Bible study.
 - 3. Merely read for a kind of therapy, little real study.

III. People Often Take Their Appearance Too Lightly.

- A. Little concern for dressing modestly (1 Tim. 2:9-10).
 - 1. *Modest* "orderly, well-arranged, decent, modest"...". (Vines)
 - 2. **Shamefastness** "that modesty which is 'fast' or rooted in the character" Vines.
 - 3. **Sobriety** "Habitual inner self-government, with it constant rein on the passions and desires ..." (Vines)
- B. Little concern about dressing lasciviously.
 - 1. Lasciviousness is a work of the flesh (Gal. 5:19).
 - 2. **Lascivious** "1. Characterized by or expressing lust or lewdness, wanton. 2. Tending to excite lustful desires" (Webster's New World Dictionary.)
- C. Little concern about hair length (1 Cor. 11:14,15)

IV. People Often Take Serving Others Too Lightly.

- A. By ignoring legitimate needs (Matt. 25-34-46).
- B. By shifting persons responsibility to the church (1 Tim. 5:16).
- C. By enabling spongers (cf. 2 Thess. 3:10).

V. People Often Take *Teaching* Too Lightly (cf. John 6:44,45).

- A. By taking responsibility *to* teach lightly (cf. Jesus and woman at well).
- B. By taking responsibility of teaching lightly (Jas. 3:1-4)

Conclusion:

- A. We need to "get real", "get serious" about things that pertain to God and His word.
- B. We need to remember what happened those in the parable who "made light of it."
