Things That Will Get Better and Better

2 Cor. 7:4-7

Introduction:

- A. Christians are indeed "troubled on every side" from "without" and "within".
 - 1. As we struggle with these troubles, we often get things out of focus.
 - a. Dwell on darkness until we see no light.
 - b. Dwell on limitations until we see no potential.
 - c. Dwell on obstacles until we see no opportunities.
 - d. Dwell on weaknesses until we see no strengths.
 - e. Dwell on conflicts until we see no peace.
 - 2. As we deal with these troubles, remember that things are already better.
 - a. Were not a people, now the people of God. (1 Pet. 2:9-10)
 - b. Were without mercy, now have mercy. (1 Pet. 2:10).
 - c. Were sold under sin, now redeemed. (1 Pet. 1:18,19).
 - d. Were polluted with sin, now purified. (1 Pet. 1:22)
 - e. Were dead in sin, now born again. (1 Pet. 1:23-25).
- B. Christians can be confident that things will get better -- and better.
 - 1. As our faith increases we will see improvement "within".
 - 2. As we work and God's providence works we will see improvement "without."

Discussion:

I. Things That Will Get Better And Better As Our Faith Increases.

- A. Our ability to discern between good and evil. (Heb. 5:12-14).
 - 1. This is the skill to judge between good and evil things or situations, based on "the word of righteousness" (v. 13)
 - a. It takes time (v. 12) and effort to develope this skill.
 - b. It improves with study, time, and practice.
 - 2. How often have we been frustrated by having misjudged a matter!
- B. Our ability to resist temptation and withstand trials. (Jas. 1:2-12).
 - 1. A we weather one storm, the next becomes easier.
 - 2. Our faith is strengthen each time it is tested (1 Pet. 1:17).
 - a. We come to realize from experience the truth of 1 Cor. 10:13.
 - b. We come to understand what true deliverance means.
- C. Our ability to forgive. (Luke 17:3-5)
 - 1. Most of us want to forgive, but find it very hard at times.
 - 2. No wonder the apostles said, "Increase our faith" right after being told to forgive seven times in a day!
- D. Our ability to deal with those who oppose the faith. (Acts 9:22).
 - 1. Many become discouraged because cannot refute error as well as others.
 - 2. Need to understand that this too, is a growing process will get better.
- E. Our ability to cope with declining physical strength. (2 Cor. 4:16-5:8)
 - 1. Age, disease, persecution and other stresses take a toll on our bodies.
 - 2. By daily spiritual renewing we put things into a better perspective.
- F. Our ability to face the prospect of death. (Phil. 1:21-26).
 - 1. As faith grows, our hope of resurrection and heaven becomes more firm.
 - 2. As faith grows, we see death less of a threat and more of an opportunity.

II. Things We Will See Getting Better And Better As We View Present Trends.

A. Besides many disturbing trends, I see some encouraging trends among churches.

- 1. If these continue things will get better and better.
- 2. Our observations and conclusions on these matters are, admittedly, somewhat subjective based on personal experience.
- B. We think we see a trend for the better in the following areas:
 - 1. Better preacher training by congregations.
 - 2. Better teaching programs in congregations' Bible classes.
 - 3. Better attitudes between brethren over personal convictions.
 - 4. Better general awareness of what is being taught in the brotherhood.

Conclusion:

We will always have problems, but if we continue to faithfully serve the Lord, things will continue to get better and better for us and finally will reach that "better country".
