 - 1. False brethren could not have it their way.
 - 2. Peter could not have it his way.
 - 3. One cannot just believe anything. (2 Thess. 2:11,12).
- B. Protestant religion has been like a swinging pendulum.
 - 1. Once it was "have it my way" rigid sectarianism.
 - 2. Now it is "have it your way" anything goes.
 - 3. Should always be "have it His way" (cf. Col. 3:27)

 - A. Ask Abel if it makes any difference. (cf. Heb. 11:4)
 - B. Ask Nadab and Abihu if it makes any difference. (Lev. 10)
 - C. Makes difference what and how we do in worship. (John 4:24)
- III. Does It Make Any Difference How We Live As Christians? (Gal. 2:11-16; Tit. 2:11,12).
 - A. Ask Ananias and Sapharia if it makes any difference? (Acts 5)
 - B. One cannot use grace of God as a license to sin. (Rom. 6; Heb. 10:26ff).
 - 1. "Once saved always saved"
 - 2. "Our sins covered by perfect life of Christ"
 - 3. "Automatic forgiveness in Christ"

Conclusion:

- A. Don't take a chance on it making no difference.
 - 1. Seek to be saved right.
 - 2. Seek to worship right.
 - 3. Seek to live right.
